## Day 1 Thursday, May 2: Depart USA

American #101

Depart New York for our pilgrimage to the United Kingdom. Complimentary dinner (D), breakfast (B), and beverages will be served on board.

## Day 2 Friday, May 3: Arrive in London I Oxford

Arrive at Heathrow Airport in London. Board our private tour bus and continue to the university town of Oxford, famous as a seat of learning for hundreds of years. Today many of the historic buildings are part of the university campus. Independent lunch.

This afternoon, visit the sites associated with the years St. John Henry Newman studied, taught, and preached while living in Oxford. Celebrate Mass at the Catholic Church of Saints Gregory and Augustine. Then, we will meet our guide for a walking tour of Oxford, which will include the new St. Bede's Hall, offering Catholic students an opportunity to study in a thoroughly Catholic environment inspired by Cardinal Newman's classic work Idea of a University. See Trinity College, Christ Church Cathedral, and St. Clement's Church.

Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Oxford. (B.D)

## Day 3 Saturday, May 4: Birmingham I Walsingham

English breakfast at our hotel. This morning, we'll leave Oxford for Birmingham. Upon arrival, celebrate Mass at Birmingham Oratory. Then we'll visit the National Shrine of St. John Newman and the many spaces once occupied by St. John Newman, where he lived and wrote his famous defenses of Catholic Christianity. The Oratory, founded by St. John Newman in 1849, played a significant part in the life of J.R.R. Tolkien, who spent most of his childhood in Birmingham with his brother and mother. All three were received into the Catholic Church in 1900. Independent lunch.

We'll leave Birmingham for Walsingham, a village in the English county of Norfolk (3-hour drive). The village is famed for its religious shrines in honor of the Virgin Mary and is a major place of pilgrimage with its history dating back to 1061. Checkin at our hotel.

Dinner and overnight at our hotel near Walsingham. (B,D)

#### Day 4 Sunday, May 5: Walsingham I London

English breakfast at our hotel. This morning, we'll visit the Catholic National Shrine of Our Lady, referred to as "England's Nazareth." Here, Richeldis de Faverches prayed that she might undertake some special work in honor of Our Lady. In answer to her prayer, the Virgin Mary led her in spirit to Nazareth, showed her the house where the Annunciation occurred, and asked her to build a replica in Walsingham to serve as a perpetual memorial of the Annunciation. Visit the "Holy House" and the Slipper Chapel, which served as a stopping point for pilgrims on their way to England's Holy Land, where shoes were removed and the last mile to Walsingham was walked barefoot. Celebrate Mass at the Shrine. Independent

Continue north to York (3-hour ride). Check-in at our hotel upon arrival. (B,D) Dinner and overnight at our hotel in York.

#### Day 5 Monday, May 6: York

English breakfast at our hotel. Begin our day with a visit to York Oratory. The present building was completed in 1864 in the Gothic Revival style and was "one of the most perfectly finished Catholic Churches in England, rich in sculpture, stained glass and fittings." The altar rails are very fine and of note. They were made in 1948 by Wilfrid Dowson, who also did work at York Minster as well as the Queen's Gates at St. George's Chapel in Windsor Castle. Celebrate Mass at York Oratory. After Mass, we'll continue to York Minster Cathedral, claimed to be the largest Gothic Cathedral north of the Alps. The windows combine to create the largest single surviving collection of Medieval stained glass in England. We'll visit the Bar Convent, England's oldest convent, founded in 1686 as a school for girls and still home to members of the Congregation of Jesus today. Independent lunch. Continue our day with a stroll through York's medieval streets, known as the "Shambles." About halfway up the Shambles, see the famous house of St. Margaret Clitheroe, who was the wife of a butcher who died when she refused to renounce the Catholic faith. She lived in this house and kept a small room to hide priests (Priest's hole) from persecution, but was arrested, tried, and crushed to death on March 25, 1586. She was made a saint in 1970. Continue to visit the Jorvik Viking Centre, a museum containing lifelike mannequins and life-size dioramas depicting Viking life in the city of York. Visitors are taken through the dioramas in small carriages equipped with speakers. It was created by the York Archaeological Trust (B,D)

Dinner and overnight at our hotel in York.

## Day 6 Tuesday, May 7: York | West Grinstead

English breakfast at our hotel. Begin our day with Mass at the house of St. Margaret Clitheroe (subject to confirmation).

This morning, we'll leave York for West Grinstead, where we will prepare for our visit to the Shrine of Our Lady of Consolation the next day (5 to 6-hour bus ride with stop en route for an independent lunch).

Late afternoon, check-in at our hotel.

Dinner and overnight at our hotel near West Grinstead.

Day 7 Wednesday, May 8: Our Lady of Consolation I Aylesford Priory

English breakfast at our hotel. This morning, we'll visit the Shrine of Our Lady of Consolation in West Grinstead, the first Shrine in honor of Our Blessed Lady to be established in England since before the Reformation. Upon arrival we will be greeted and given an historical talk about the shrine. Then we will pray the mid-day Angelus and celebrate Mass at the Shrine (Extraordinary Form). A boxed picnic lunch will be provided. After lunch we will make a brief visit to the Secret Chapel in the Priest's House.

Continue to Aylesford Priory in the Archdiocese of Southark. Check-in at the Friars Aylesford guesthouse (to be confirmed).

Dinner and overnight at Friars Aylesford Guest House. (B.D)

#### Day 8 Thursday, May 9: Aylesford Priory I Highlights of London

English breakfast at our hotel. This morning, we'll tour "The Friars." Aylesford Priory in Kent is one of the ancient houses of the Carmelite Order and a major place of pilgrimage. The shrine at Aylesford is dedicated to Our Lady of the Assumption, and beautiful chapels dedicated to the saints of Carmel (notably St. Simon Stock) have been described as "prayers in stone." Celebrate Mass. After Mass enjoy a group lunch at The Friars.

This afternoon, we'll continue to London. Upon arrival we'll have an orientation tour of London, passing the Houses of Parliament, Big Ben, Trafalgar Square, Nelson's Column, Piccadilly Circus, and the London Eye. We'll pass by the House of Commons, where St. Thomas More was put on trial, and continue to visit the Tower of London. Visit the Chapel Royal of St. Peter ad Vincula, the parish church of the Tower of London and burial place of St. Thomas More and St. John Fisher. Independent dinner.

Overnight at our hotel in London.

## Day 9 Friday, May 10: London | Westminster Abbey

English breakfast at our hotel. Begin our day with a visit to the Church of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, popularly known as Brompton Oratory, the second largest Catholic Church in London. Soon after converting to Catholicism in 1845, John Henry Newman became an Oratorian and brought St. Philip's Oratory from Rome to England. The first English foundation was in Birmingham. Later, another group of converts included Fr. Frederick William Faber, a noted English hymn writer and theologian who converted from Anglicanism to Catholicism. After our visit we'll continue to The Mall and Buckingham Palace, where the Changing of the Guard takes place daily. Celebrate Mass at Corpus Christi Church (The Shrine of the Blessed Sacrament) or St. Etheldrea's, the oldest Roman Catholic Church in England. Independent lunch.

This afternoon we'll visit Westminster Abbey. This impressive building was originally a Benedictine Monastery, offering traditional Benedictine hospitality to visitors. It has been used as the setting for Coronations since 1066 and contains tombs of many British Kings and Queens.

Dinner and overnight at our hotel in London.

# Day 10 Saturday, May 11: Tyburn Convent | St. Paul's Cathedral |

#### Westminster Cathedral

English breakfast at our hotel. Begin our day with a visit to Tyburn Convent and shrine, dedicated to the Catholic Martyrs who gave witness to their faith during the Reformation. The Tyburn nuns are Benedictine Adorers of the Sacred Heart of Jesus of Montmartre, whose life is centered on Eucharistic Adoration. Celebrate Mass at the Altar of the Martyrs (possible meeting with the Sisters). Continue to St. Paul's (Anglican) Cathedral, seat of the Bishop of London, for a photo opportunity. Independent lunch.

After lunch we'll visit Westminster Cathedral. The remainder of the afternoon is free to explore London on your own. Perhaps you would like to visit the famous museums, galleries, and concert halls, or enjoy shopping at fashionable Harrods in Knightsbridge. Other popular touring sites include Westminster Abbey and the Tower of London. You might also consider attending Evensong at Westminster Abbey or see an evening show in London's West End.

Independent dinner. Overnight at our hotel in London.

#### Day 11 Sunday, May 12: Return to the USA

Celebrate Mass (location to be advised). After breakfast, we will be transferred to London Heathrow Airport for our return flight to the USA. Arrive home the same
