#### Day 1 Monday, July 29: Depart for Ireland

Depart Chicago O'Hare International Airport for our flight to Shannon, Ireland. Complimentary meals and beverages will be served on board.

#### Day 2 Tuesday, July 30: Arrive in Shannon I Clonmacnoise I Mayo

Morning arrival at Shannon Airport, proceed through Passport Control, claim our luggage, and meet our Peter's Way tour manager as we exit from Customs. As our hotel rooms are unlikely to be ready, board our comfortable touring bus and we will be on our way to visit Clonmacnoise, an early Christian site founded by St. Ciarán in the mid-6th century on the eastern bank of the River Shannon. In a stunning setting, the site includes the ruins of a cathedral, seven churches from the 10th to 13th centuries, two round towers, three high crosses, and the largest collection of early Christian graveslabs in Western Europe. The original high crosses and a selection of graveslabs are on display in the visitor center. In 1979, Pope John Paul II celebrated mass at this site. Guided tours are provided and the long and varied history of Clonmacnoise is recounted in an audiovisual presentation shown in the visitor center. There are also exhibitions that teach about the flora, fauna, and landscape of the region. Independent lunch. We'll continue to Mayo for hotel check-in.

Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Mayo.

## Day 3 Wednesday, July 31: Connemara I Kylemore Abbey I Cruise on Killary Fjord

Irish breakfast at our hotel. This morning, travel through the Connemara Region, a land of lakes and rivers, bogs and mountains. It is dotted with small villages where Gaelic is still the spoken language and little has changed since the beginning of time. It is without a doubt the wildest and the most romantic part of Ireland. Connemara is a vast peninsula bordered by the arid and rocky coastline of Galway Bay in the south, a land characteristic for its stone walls and thatched cottages. On its northern shore the land is harsher and more removed, with spectacular views of the ocean and the beautiful fjord of Killary Harbour, as well as the steep mountains overlooking numerous lakes and large bogs. Connemara is a real paradise for nature lovers. In 1951, John Ford's great movie, The Quiet Man, starring John Wayne, Maureen O'Hara, and Barry Fitzgerald was made, and filming was centered in the village of Cong on the Mayo-Galway border. Continue on to visit the famous lakeside Kylemore Abbey, in the heart of Connemara. Originally a castle, built in 1867 as a romantic gift, Kylemore is steeped in history and tales of romance, tragedy, and success. Now home to Ireland's only community of Benedictine nuns since 1920, this 1,000-acre estate offers visitors the experience of a Victorian atmosphere in the restored rooms of the abbey, miniature Gothic church, and Head Gardiner's House. Relax in the coffee shop and enjoy the Kylemore Abbey Craft and Design Shop. Independent lunch.

Enjoy a cruise on Killary Fjord, Ireland's only fjord at Killary Harbour in Connemara, boasting some of the finest scenery in the West of Ireland with the Connemara mountains to the south and the Mweelrea mountains to the north. The cruise travels along the ninemile-long inlet, and because of its sheltered nature, the waters are always calm. Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Mayo.

#### Day 4 Thursday, August 1: National Shrine of Knock | Derry

Irish breakfast at our hotel. This morning we'll leave Westport for Ireland's National Marian Shrine in Knock, County Mayo. The Story of Knock began on the evening of August 21, 1879, when the Virgin Mary, St. Joseph and St. John the Evangelist appeared at the south gable of the church at Knock. Beside them was an altar with a cross and the figure of a lamb, around which angels hovered. There were fifteen official witnesses to the apparition who watched and prayed for two hours in the pouring rain. Since then, this Marian Shrine has attracted millions of pilgrims each year from all over the world. The special message of Knock is the need for penance. Celebrate Mass at the Shrine. After Mass, possible 20-minute concert. Independent lunch in Knock.

We'll continue north to Derry. Upon arrival, enjoy a walking tour of the Derry City Walls. These famous walls date back to the early seventeenth century. There are fine views from the top of the walls, which encircle the old city. Walking along Derry's Walls, we have splendid views of cathedrals and churches and learn about the historical events that shaped the city. See attractions such as the Bogside, the People's Gallery of Murals, the Diamond, the Tower Museum, and the Guildhall. We'll also visit the tomb of Sister Clare Crockett in the City Cemetery on Lone Moor Road. After our visit we'll check in at

Day 5 Friday, August 2: Derry I Dublin

Irish breakfast at our hotel. This morning, we'll leave Derry for Dublin. Upon arrival, we'll visit St. Patrick's Cathedral. Built in honor of Ireland's patron saint, St. Patrick's Cathedral stands adjacent to the famous well where tradition says St. Patrick baptized converts on his visit to Dublin. St. Patrick's is Gothic in style and its splendid interior is adorned with funeral monuments, such as The Boyle Family Memorial and the grave of Dean Jonathan Swift (author of Gulliver's Travels). Swift was dean here until his death in 1745 The chancel has ornate stained-glass windows and spectacular choir stalls, once used by the knights of St. Patrick, that adjoin the altar. The massive west towers house a large peal of bells whose ringing tones are so much part of the character of Dublin. Lunchtime concert presentation at St. Patrick's Cathedral, presented by St. Anthony Camerata Chorale Festival Choir. Independent lunch.

This afternoon, enjoy a panoramic tour of Dublin. First, we will discover the north side of

the river Liffey. This area offers great striking monuments such as the GPO (General Post Office) on the city main thoroughfare, O'Connell Street, the Custom House along the quays, and Phoenix Park, the largest public park in Europe. The south side appears more sophisticated with its vast Georgian squares, such as Merrion Square, where Oscar Wilde's house can still be found. Visit Grafton Street, with its colorful doors and quality shops. Not far from St. Stephen's Green, on Kildare Street, we will see the house of Bram Stoker, the author of Dracula. Visit Trinity College to view the eighth-century illustrated manuscript, The Book of Kells. Check-in at our hotel in Dublin. (B.D)

Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Dublin.

#### Day 6 Saturday, August 3: Dublin I Belfast I Ayrshire, Scotland I Fort William

Irish breakfast at our hotel. This morning, we'll leave Dublin to take the ferry from Belfast to Scotland and continue to Ayrshire.

Upon arrival in Ayrshire, a stop will be made to visit Robert Burns Birthplace Museum, offering a truly unique encounter with Scotland's favorite son. The museum comprises the famous Burns Cottage where the poet was born, the historic landmarks where he set his greatest work, the elegant monument and gardens created in his honor, and a modern museum housing the world's most important collection of his life and works. 15minute choral selection at Robert Burns Museum. Independent lunch.

We'll continue to Fort William for hotel check-in.

Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Fort William.

#### Day 7 Sunday, August 4: Fort William I Isle of Skye

Scottish breakfast at our hotel. Today we'll leave on our excursion to visit Eilean Donan Castle. Eilean Donan is a small tidal island situated at the confluence of three sea lochs in the western Highlands of Scotland. After our visit, we'll continue to visit the Isle of Skye. Connected to Scotland's northwest coast by bridge, it is known for its rugged landscapes, picturesque fishing villages, and medieval castles. The largest island in the Inner Hebrides archipelago, it has an indented coastline of peninsulas and narrow lochs, radiating out from a mountainous interior. The town of Portree, a base for exploring the island, features harborside pubs and boutiques.

Celebrate Mass (location to be confirmed). Independent lunch. Free afternoon to

explore Portree on your own. Late afternoon, return to Fort William. Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Fort William.

## Day 8 Monday, August 5: Stirling Castle | Edinburgh | Rosslyn Chapel

Scottish breakfast at our hotel. This morning, we'll leave Oban and travel to Edinburgh. En-route we'll visit one of Scotland's most magnificent castles, Stirling Castle. It was built on a rocky outcrop as an almost impregnable fortification and we can explore many

aspects of its long military history. Independent lunch.

Continue to Edinburgh to visit Roslyn Chapel, where we will tour the chapel and the grounds. Construction of the chapel began on September 20, 1456, although it has often been recorded as 1446. Although the original building was to be cruciform in shape, it was never completed; only the choir was constructed, with the retro-chapel, otherwise called the Lady Chapel, built on the much earlier crypt (Lower Chapel), believed to form part of an earlier castle. The foundations of the un-built nave and transepts stretching to a distance of 90 feet were recorded in the 19th century. The decorative carving was executed over a forty-year period. After the founder's death, construction of the planned nave and transepts was abandoned—either from lack of funds, lack of interest, or a change in liturgical fashion. The Lower Chapel (also known as the crypt or sacristy) should not be confused with the burial vaults that lie underneath Rosslyn Chapel. Check-in at our hotel in Edinburgh. Early dinner at our hotel. Free time to explore the Old Town or go pub hopping. Perhaps you'd like to visit the Royal Edinburgh Military Tattoo.

## Day 9 Tuesday, August 6: Edinburgh Castle I St. Giles' Cathedral I Holy

#### Rood Palace | Farewell Dinner

Scottish breakfast at our hotel. Begin our day with a visit to Edinburgh Castle. No one is sure who first used the castle rock as a settlement, but it was long before the Romans came sailing up the Forth and landed at Cramond. The oldest building in all Edinburgh is to be found within the castle precincts. It is St. Margaret's Chapel, a tiny Norman building, which has been intact for more than 900 years. From the battlements, an immediate appreciation of the dramatic topography of Edinburgh can be seen, situated between sea and hills. The castle was the seat (and regular refuge) of Scottish Kings, and the Royal apartments include a tiny room in which Mary, Queen of Scots, gave birth to the boy who was to become King James VI of Scotland and James I of England upon the death of Queen Elizabeth in 1603. Edinburgh Castle is also the home of the "One O'Clock Gun." Continue on to St. Giles' Cathedral. This fine building, named after St. Giles the Patron Saint of Lepers, is located in the Royal Mile. It dates back to 1120 and is famous for its stained-glass windows, magnificent organ, and exquisite "Thistle Chapel." Independent lunch.

After lunch, continue on to visit the Palace of Holyrood and the Abbey. The abbey dates from around 1128, and the palace dates from the 16th century. The English burned the abbey in 1544, and Bonnie Prince Charles resided there in 1745. Today, Holyrood House is the Edinburgh official residence of the British Royal Family. Free afternoon to explore Edinburgh on your own. Farewell dinner at a local restaurant.

Overnight at our hotel in Edinburgh.

#### Day 10 Wednesday, August 7: Return from Edinburgh

Scottish breakfast at our hotel. This morning we will transferred by coach to Edinburgh Airport for our return flight home. (B)

#### Optional 4-Night Extension to London

For those interested, we will have an optional 4-night extension to London, taking the East Coast Main Line train from Edinburgh to London and returning via United Airlines from London to Chicago. Hotel and pricing to be advised after the number of travelers is confirmed. The extension will include daily English breakfast at our hotel and free days for sightseeing, shopping, and trips to the theatre or opera on our own.

ACCOMMODATIONS/SINGLE TRAVELERS: The package price is based on double occupancy (two twin beds). Married couples may request a double bed which is subject to availability. Triple rooms (two twin beds plus rollaway) may be requested; with no discount for triple occupancy. Single rooms may be requested at time of booking. Single rooms are limited, subject to confirmation, may be smaller, and located apart from the room block. If a single room is confirmed, an additional charge of \$1,195.00 will apply. We cannot guarantee roommate requests but will make every effort to pair you with another traveler, if double occupancy is requested. If a single room must be assigned due to lack of a traveler to pair you with, a roommate's cancellation, incompatibility, or any other reason (at the last moment or while on tour), you will be charged the single supplement.

MEALS: Breakfast and dinner daily, including a farewell dinner prior to departure.

**GRATUITIES & SERVICE CHARGES:** Gratuities are not included in your tour package. Although voluntary, for good work we recommend the equivalent of \$5.00 per person per day for your tour manager; \$2.00 per person per day for your bus driver; and \$2.00 per tour for local guides. Tips for your tour manager and bus driver are

normally given as a group at the end of the tour. All service charges and local taxes as imposed by hotels are included in the program rate. Although service charges are included, it is customary to leave the equivalent of \$1.00 per person for the wait staff after each meal and \$1.00 per person per day for housekeeping.
