Day 1 Monday, July 29: Depart for Ireland

Depart Chicago O'Hare International Airport to Dublin, Ireland. Complimentary dinner (D), breakfast (B), and beverages will be served on board the transatlantic flight.

Day 2 Tuesday, July 30: Arrive in Dublin I St. Patrick's Cathedral

Arrive at Dublin Airport, proceed through Passport Control, claim our luggage, and meet our Peter's Way tour manager as we exit from Customs. As our hotel rooms are unlikely to be ready, board our comfortable touring bus and we will be on our way to enjoy a panoramic tour of Dublin City. Here we will discover the north and south side of the River Liffey. This area offers great striking monuments such as the GPO (General Post Office) on the city main thoroughfare, O'Connell Street, the Custom House along the quays, and Phoenix Park, the largest public park in Europe. The south side appears more sophisticated with its vast Georgian squares, such as Merrion Square, where Oscar Wilde's House can still be found (today owned by an American College), along with Grafton Street and its quality shops. Not so far from St. Stephen's Green on Kildare Street, we will see the house of Bram Stoker, the author of Dracula. This part of the city is also dominated by the students of Trinity College, where the famous book of Kells is permanently exhibited in its library. The university is facing the medieval district where Dublin Castle and the two Anglican Cathedrals can be found.

Continue to St. Patrick's Cathedral for rehearsal and 1:00 p.m. concert presentation by St. Anthony Camerata Chorale. Independent lunch.

After lunch, visit Trinity College to view the eighth-century illustrated manuscript, *The Book of Kells*. Check-in at our hotel and enjoy the balance of the afternoon at leisure. Dinner and overnight at the Address Citywest in Dublin. (D)

Day 3 Wednesday, July 31: Clonmacnoise I Knock

Irish breakfast at our hotel. This morning, we'll leave Dublin and board our comfortable touring bus to visit Clonmacnoise, an early Christian site founded by St. Ciarán in the mid-6th century on the eastern bank of the River Shannon. In a stunning setting, the site includes the ruins of a cathedral, seven churches from the 10th to 13th centuries, two round towers, three high crosses, and the largest collection of early Christian graveslabs in Western Europe. The original high crosses and a selection of graveslabs are on display in the visitor center. In 1979, Pope John Paul II celebrated mass at this site. Guided tours are provided and the long and varied history of Clonmacnoise is recounted in an audiovisual presentation shown in the visitor center. There are also exhibitions that teach about the flora, fauna, and landscape of the region. Independent lunch.

We'll arrive in Knock in time for the 3:00 p.m. Mass at the Basilica in Knock, presented by St. Anthony Camerata Chorale, followed by a 15-minute concert presentation. After Mass, we'll visit the Knock Shrine. The story of Knock began on the evening of August 21, 1879, when the Virgin Mary, St. Joseph, and St. John the Evangelist appeared at the south gable of the church at Knock. Beside them was an altar with a cross and the figure of a lamb, around which angels hovered. There were fifteen official witnesses to the apparition who watched and prayed for two hours in the pouring rain. Since then, this Marian Shrine has attracted millions of pilgrims each year from all over the world.

Dinner and overnight at Hotel Knock. (B,D)

Day 4 Thursday, August 1: Knock | Derry

Irish breakfast at our hotel. This morning we'll travel north to Derry (three-hour bus ride). Upon arrival, enjoy a walking tour of the Derry City Walls. These famous walls date back to the early seventeenth century. There are fine views from the top of the walls, which encircle the old city. Walking along Derry's walls, we'll enjoy splendid views of cathedrals and churches and learn about the historical events that shaped the city. See attractions such as the Bogside, the People's Gallery of Murals, the Diamond, the Tower Museum, and the Guildhall. We'll also visit the tomb of Sister Clare Crockett in the City Cemetery on Lone Moor Road. Independent lunch. Hotel check-in.

Evening Sung Mass at St. Eugene Cathedral (*subject to confirmation***).**Dinner and overnight at City Hotel in Derry. (B,D)

Day 5 Friday, August 2: Derry | Giant's Causeway | Belfast

Irish breakfast at our hotel. This morning, we'll leave Derry and drive along the Antrim Coast of Ireland to explore the Giant's Causeway, huge hexagonal columns formed over 60 million years ago. Learn about the folklore and legend of the 54-foot tall Finn McCool and his wife Oonagh. After our visit we'll continue to Belfast. Independent lunch.

Enjoy a guided city tour, an excellent way to discover Belfast City. We'll take in the leaning Albert Memorial Clock tower (Ireland's answer to the Tower of Pisa) and the Opera House, one of Belfast's great landmarks. We will pass by City Hall, the Opera house, the Crown Bar (dates back to 1885), Queens University, and the Botanic Gardens. Optional visit to the Harland and Wolfe Shipyard, where the Titanic was built and launched in 1912.

Dinner and overnight at Hotel Ramada by Wyndham in Belfast.

Day 6 Saturday, August 3: Belfast I Cairnryan, Scotland I Glencoe

Early Irish breakfast at our hotel. At 7:30 a.m. we'll take the ferry from Belfast to Cairnryan, Scotland (2.5-hour ferry). Upon arrival in Cairnryan, a visit Robert Burns' Birthplace Museum, offering a truly unique encounter with Scotland's favorite son. The museum comprises the famous Burns Cottage where the poet was born, the historic landmarks where he set his greatest work, the elegant monument and gardens created in his honor, and a modern museum housing the world's most important collection of his life and works. Independent lunch.

We'll continue to Glencoe for hotel check-in. At 6:00 p.m., celebrate Vigil Mass at Good Shepherd Catholic Church, sung by St. Anthony Camerata Chorale.

Dinner and overnight at our Lodge on the Loch in Glencoe near Loch Leven. (B,D)

Day 7 Sunday, August 4: Isle of Skye

Scottish breakfast at our hotel. Today we'll leave on our excursion to Isle of Skye via the Skye Bridge. A stop will be made for a photo opportunity at Eilean Donan Castle. Eilean Donan is a small tidal island situated at the confluence of three sea lochs in the western Highlands of Scotland. Independent lunch en-route to Isle of Skye.

We'll continue to visit the Isle of Skye. Connected to Scotland's northwest coast by bridge, it is known for its rugged landscapes, picturesque fishing villages, and medieval castles. The largest island in the Inner Hebrides archipelago, it has an indented coastline of peninsulas and narrow lochs, radiating out from a mountainous interior. The town of Portree, a base for exploring the island, features harborside pubs and boutiques. Return to our Lodge in Glencoe.

Dinner and overnight at our Lodge on the Loch in Glencoe near Loch Leven. (B,D)

Day 8 Monday, August 5: Stirling Castle I Edinburgh I Rosslyn Chapel Scottish breakfast at our hotel. This morning, we'll leave Glencoe for Edinburgh. If time permits, we'll make a stop en route to see the exterior and courtyard of Doune Castle, a highlight for *Outlander* fans. Then, we'll visit one of Scotland's most magnificent castles, Stirling Castle. It was built on a rocky outcrop as an almost impregnable fortification and

we can explore many aspects of its long military history. Independent lunch. Continue to Edinburgh to visit Roslyn Chapel, where we will tour the chapel and the grounds. Construction of the chapel began on September 20, 1456, although it has often been recorded as 1446. Although the original building was to be cruciform in shape, it was never completed; only the choir was constructed, with the retro-chapel, otherwise called the Lady Chapel, built on the much earlier crypt (Lower Chapel), believed to form part of an earlier castle. The foundations of the un-built nave and transepts stretching to a distance of 90 feet were recorded in the 19th century. The decorative carving was executed over a forty-year period. After the founder's death, construction of the planned nave and transepts was abandoned—either from lack of funds, lack of interest, or a change in liturgical fashion. The Lower Chapel (also known as the crypt or sacristy) should not be confused with the burial vaults that lie underneath Rosslyn Chapel. Check-in at Hotel Delta by Marriott in a suburb of Edinburgh.

Perhaps you'd like to visit the Royal Edinburgh Military Tattoo.

Dinner and overnight at Hotel Delta by Marriott in a suburb of Edinburgh. (B,D)

Day 9 Tuesday, August 6: Edinburgh Castle I St. Giles' Cathedral I Holy Rood Palace I Farewell Dinner

Scottish breakfast at our hotel. Begin our day with a visit to Edinburgh Castle. No one is sure who first used the castle rock as a settlement, but it was long before the Romans came sailing up the Forth and landed at Cramond. The oldest building in all Edinburgh is to be found within the castle precincts. It is St. Margaret's Chapel, a tiny Norman building, which has been intact for more than 900 years. From the battlements, an immediate appreciation of the dramatic topography of Edinburgh can be seen, situated between sea and hills. The castle was the seat (and regular refuge) of Scottish Kings, and the Royal apartments include a tiny room in which Mary, Queen of Scots, gave birth to the boy who was to become King James VI of Scotland and James I of England upon the death of Queen Elizabeth in 1603. Edinburgh Castle is also the home of the "One O'Clock Gun." Continue on to St. Giles' Cathedral. This fine building, named after St. Giles the Patron Saint of Lepers, is located in the Royal Mile. It dates back to 1120 and is famous for its stained-glass windows, magnificent organ, and exquisite "Thistle Chapel." Independent lunch.

After lunch, continue on to visit the Palace of Holyrood and the Abbey. The abbey dates from around 1128, and the palace dates from the 16th century. The English burned the abbey in 1544, and Bonnie Prince Charles resided there in 1745. Today, Holyrood House is the Edinburgh official residence of the British Royal Family. Perhaps you'd like to visit the Royal Edinburgh Military Tattoo.

Enjoy a farewell dinner at a local restaurant with entertainment.

Overnight at Hotel Delta by Marriott in a suburb of Edinburgh. (B,D)

Day 10 Wednesday, August 7: Return from Edinburgh

Scottish breakfast at our hotel. This morning we will transferred by coach to Edinburgh Airport for our return flight home. Those continuing on to London will be transfered by coach to the train station.

Optional 4-Night Extension to London

For those interested, we will have an optional 4-night extension to London, taking the East Coast Main Line train from Edinburgh to London and returning via Aer Lingus from London to Chicago. Hotel and pricing to be advised after the number of travelers is confirmed. The extension will include daily English breakfast at our hotel and free days for sightseeing, shopping, and trips to the theatre or opera on our own.

Although voluntary, for good work we recommend the equivalent of \$5.00 per person per day for your tour manager; \$2.00 per person per day for your bus driver; and \$2.00 per tour for local guides. Tips for your tour manager and bus driver are

normally given as a group at the end of the tour. All service charges and local taxes as imposed by hotels are included in the program rate. Although service charges are included, it is customary to leave the equivalent of \$1.00 per person for the wait staff after each meal and \$1.00 per person per day for housekeeping.

Most pilgrimages entail a lot of walking, stairs, hills, cobblestone roads, etc. Tour buses are not equipped with wheelchair ramps.
