Celebrate Mass at the Church of the Presentation of the Virgin Mary in Wadowice, where Karol Wojtyla was baptized, and visit the Divine Mercy Shrine, dedicated by St. John Paul II during his last visit to Poland.

DAY 1 <u>October 14, Tuesday: Depart USA</u> Depart Menominee, MI for Chicago O'Hare International Airport (*Refer* to enrollment form for option to add roundtrip domestic motorcoach transfers at additional cost). Upon arrival to ORD, check-in for our transatlantic flight to Warsaw, Poland. Dinner, breakfast, and beverages will be served on board.

DAY 2 October 15, Wednesday: Arrive in Warsaw

Arrive at Warsaw International Airport, proceed through Passport Control, claim our luggage, and meet a Peter's Way tour manager as we exit Customs. Board our comfortable touring bus and we will be on our way to Warsaw, the capital of Poland. Enjoy a brief panoramic tour of the city. We'll visit St. Stanislaw Kostka Church, the national shrine of Bl. Jerzy Popieluszko, martyr for the faith. Celebrate Mass. After Mass, visit his grave located outside the church. Independent lunch. back in at our botal in Marsaw

Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Warsaw.	(B.D)

DAY 3 October 16, Thursday: Highlight Tour of Warsaw

Breakfast at our hotel. Begin our day with Mass at St. James Convent, where St. Faustina entered the Monastery. After receiving direction from the Lord in Lodz's Cathedral, St. Faustina arrived at this church on the outskirts of Warsaw, where the priest directed her to the home of a Catholic woman for lodging. During her stay with the Lipzye family, Faustina discerned her religious vocation with the Congregation of the Sisters of our Lady of Mercy on Zytnia Street. Enjoy a full-day sightseeing tour of Poland's capital. We will explore the Old Town, painstakingly rebuilt after World War II, with its charming little streets and cafes. Tour highlights include the royal castle and Warsaw Ghetto. Independent lunch. After lunch, drive along the royal route through the glamorous Nowy Swiat shopping street, mostly rebuilt after WWII. The route is lined with government buildings and embassies ending at Lazienki Park. Dinner at a local restaurant. Overnight at our hotel in Warsaw. (B,D)

DAY 4 October 17, Friday: Niepokalanow | Częstochowa

Breakfast at our hotel. This morning, we'll leave Warsaw to visit Niepokalanow, where St. Maximillian Kolbe initiated the "City of the Immaculata." By 1939, the city had expanded from eighteen friars to an incredible 650, making it the largest Catholic religious house in the world. Independent lunch. After lunch, continue to Częstochowa. Celebrate Mass at Jasna Gora, the Paulite Monastery and largest Marian shrine in Poland, home to the miraculous "Black Madonna." After Mass, enjoy a guided visit of the monastery, with its Chapel of the Virgin, where the sacred icon is kept for veneration by the faithful. We will also visit the beautiful Basilica of the Holy Cross and the Nativity of Mary, with its magnificent Baroque altar depicting the Assumption of Our Lady into Heaven. Tour the monastery's museum, which houses offerings from the prisoners of the Nazi and communist concentration camps. The treasury houses many votive offerings left by pilgrims, including those given to the monastery by Pope St. John Paul II. Check-in at our hotel in Częstochowa.

Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Częstochowa. (B,D)

DAY 5 October 18, Saturday: Częstochowa | Zakopane

Breakfast at our hotel. This morning, return to the Shrine of Our Lady of Częstochowa to celebrate Mass. After Mass, we will depart Częstochowa for Zakopane, nestled in the Tatra Mountains. The Tatras are the highest part of the Carpathian mountain range. St. John Paul II spent a lot of his time in these mountains as a hiker, skier, traveler, and priest with youth trips, and returned to the area he loved several times as Pope. Independent lunch. Enjoy free time at Krupowki Street, a pedestrian area lined with coffee shops and souvenir shops.

Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Zakopane.

DAY 6 October 19, Sunday: Zakopane | Krakow

Breakfast at our hotel. Begin our day with a visit to the Sanctuary of Our Lady of Fatima in Krzeptowki, which was built by the mountaineers in gratitude to the Virgin Mary for saving the life of the Pope from an as-sassination attempt. The oldest part of the complex is the Chapel of the Immaculate Heart of Virgin Mary, built in 1951, with the statue of Our Lady of Fatima located inside. In your free time, you can take the scenic gondola to the top of Mount Gubalowka for a bird's eye view of the city and the Tatras. Independent lunch. This afternoon, we will continue to Krakow. Celebrate Mass in Krakow (location to be advised). After Mass, check-in at our hotel. Free afternoon to explore Krakow on your own. Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Krakow. (B.D)

DAY 7 October 20, Monday: Highlights of Krakow | Wieliczka Salt Mines

Breakfast at our hotel. After breakfast, our local guide will take us to visit St. Stanislaus Kostka Church where, as a seminarian, Karol Wojtyla attended Mass every day and offered his second Mass as a priest. Celebrate Mass at St. Stanislaus. After Mass, continue to Wawel Cathedral, the burial place of Polish kings. St. John Paul II offered his first Mass here in the . Crypt of St. Leonard. We'll continue in the footsteps of St. John Paul II to visit Kanonicza Street in the Old Town, where he resided while living in Krakow. Explore the courtyards of the Collegium Maius. Visit the Franciscan Church where Fr. Wojtyla loved to come and spend quiet time in prayer. Pass the Archbishop's Palace to see where Fr. Wojtyla attended the seminary, was ordained, and lived as a Cardinal. In the Old Town, we will visit the Basilica of St. Mary (Mariacki). See the noon opening of Europe's largest Gothic wooden altar, built in the 15th century from gilded linden wood. Continue to Market Square, one of the largest medieval market squares in Europe. Independent lunch in the Old Town. This afternoon, we will tour Wieliczka, one of the oldest salt mines in Europe. Wieliczka is a unique place where many generations of Polish miners have created a world of underground salt lakes with a rich interior of decorated chapels, including the famous Blessed Kings Chapel, plus other galleries and workings made of salt. Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Krakow. (B,D)

DAY 8 October 21, Tuesday: Auschwitz | Divine Mercy Shrine John Paul II Center

Breakfast at our hotel. After breakfast, depart Krakow for Auschwitz. Upon arrival we will have a guided tour of the former concentration camp and museum, including "Auschwitz II" at Birkenau. Auschwitz was a Nazi death camp, where over 4 million people, mostly of Jewish descent, were executed during World War II. It is also the site of martyrdom for St. Maximilian Kolbe, who willingly offered to die in a stranger's place as an act of Christian charity. Edith Stein (St. Theresa Benedicta) also died here as she stood up for the lives of others. Independent lunch. Return to Krakow to visit the Divine Mercy Shrine. Our tour includes the original burial site of St. Faustina. Celebrate Mass at the Shrine. Continue to the John Paul II Center. See the octagonal lower church dedicated to John Paul II, known as the Church of the Relics (Kosciol Relikwii), decorated with vividly-colored images depicting events from the pontificate of Pope John Paul II. The centerpiece of the shrine is a simple marble altar that contains a vial with the blood of St. John Paul II displayed in a glass case. Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Krakow. (B,D)

DAY 9 October 22, Wednesday: Kalwaria | Wadowice

Breakfast at our hotel. This morning we'll leave Krakow on our excursion to Kalwaria Zebrzydowska to visit the Benedictine Abbey, where we will see the miraculous icon of the Virgin Mary that millions have come on pilgrimage to view. We will have plenty of time to explore the forty chapels or walk and pray the Stations of the Cross. Saint John Paul II often visited here as a boy and as a young man. Independent lunch. Continue to Wadowice, hometown of Saint John Paul II. Visit the Church of the Presentation of the Virgin Mary in Wadowice, where Karol Wojtyla was baptised. Celebrate Mass. After Mass, we'll visit the Museum of John Paul II, recently renovated and reopened. The museum tells the story of the Greatest of the Poles, from his early years in the small multicultural town of Wadowice until his last days as a bishop of Rome. Return to hotel in Krakow to freshen-up. Farewell dinner at a restaurant in Krakow. Overnight at our hotel in Krakow. (B.D)

DAY 10 October 23, Thursday: Return to the USA

Breakfast at our hotel. After breakfast, we will be transferred to Krakow Airport for our return flight, via Warsaw, to the USA. (B)

U.S. Passports must be valid for at least six (6) months after the return date. Special entry requirements for non-U.S. citizens may apply. AIR TRANSPORTATION: This travel package includes round-trip economy class airfare from Chicago. Flight itinerary and carrier may be subject to change. The insurance premium is based on total package price, including taxes, fuel surcharges, single supplements, deviation fees, late charges, etc (see chart below). If the insurance premium is included with your deposit, the passenger will be covered for pre-existing conditions. The insurance plan can be purchased at any time thereafter, excluding coverage for preexisting conditions, until final payment has been made. Plan payments will not be accepted after final payment has been made. All plan payments are nonrefundable. If you choose to extend your stay or plan a pre-tour program, travel insurance can be purchased for an additional \$4.00 per day. Additional coverage needs to be requested. The insurance plan will not automatically be extended. The insurance plan will only cover pre-paid arrangements made through PWT. Passengers who book their own airfare (Land Only passengers or those booking independent connecting flights) are advised to purchase travel insurance covering their flights directly from the airline or from another travel insurance supplier. The Passenger Travel Protection Plan includes coverage for the following: trip cancellation/ interruption/delay, accident/sickness medical expense, emergency medical evacuation /repatriation, lost baggage/personal effects, accidental death & dismemberment, and 24-hour Emergency Travel Assistance Services. Benefits and reimbursement is up to 100% of the non-refundable payments for your trip. Once you begin your trip, coverage under the plan will end as soon as you go back to your return destination. This means that if you return home early, your coverage will terminate early as well. Losses incurred after your coverage ends cannot be reimbursed.
