Then, we'll move farther into the untamed Highlands over craggy hills laden with lochs, Gaelic-speaking villages, prehistoric thatched-roofed huts, and castles. Day hikers are welcome to join me on a full-day hike up Ben Nevis. Peter's Way has planned a lovely alternative on this day for those who prefer to spend a day at leisure or explore Fort William and Glenfinnan.

The highlight of each day on pilgrimage will be sharing the Eucharist around The Table of the Lord. But we'll also share around a table with food and drink of the region (porridge, fresh fish, Grouse, Cullen Skink, Cranachan, and Haggis for the brave of heart!)

Day 1 Monday, June 19: Depart USA

Depart from Newark Liberty International Airport for our pilgrimage to Scotland. Dinner, breakfast, and beverages will be served on board. (D)

Day 2 Tuesday, June 20: Welcome to Scotland! | Rosslyn Chapel | Edinburgh

Arrive at Edinburgh Airport, proceed through Passport Control, claim our luggage, and meet a Peter's Way tour manager upon exiting Customs. Board our private tour bus and we will be on our way to Edinburgh for a tour of Rosslyn Chapel. Rosslyn Chapel, originally named the Collegiate Church of St. Matthew, is a 15th-century church in the village of Roslin, seven miles from Edinburgh. Rosslyn was founded as a Roman Catholic church where worship took place until the Scottish Reformation. Today it is a working church in the Scottish Episcopalian tradition. The entire chapel is elaborately carved in deeply meaningful ways, "a Bible in Stone."

Hotel check-in. **Celebrate Mass at St. Mary's Catholic Cathedral.** Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Edinburgh. (B,D)

Day 3 Wednesday, June 21: Highlights of Edinburgh

Breakfast at our hotel. **Celebrate Mass at St. Patrick's Catholic Church.** Today we will explore Edinburgh. Travel along Princes Street and the Royal Mile, with its historic buildings, quaint shops, narrow lanes, and hidden courtyards, the home of John Knox, and St. Giles' Cathedral. This fine building, named after St. Giles the Patron Saint of Lepers, dates back to 1120 and is famous for its stained glass windows, magnificent organ, and exquisite "Thistle Chapel." Independent lunch. Visit Edinburgh Castle, a world-famous icon of Scotland. The oldest part of the castle is St. Margaret's Chapel. Scotland's royals once knelt to worship in this serene private chapel. Although it doesn't date to the time of Margaret herself, it is believed to have been created by her son, King David I of Scotland, in the early 12th century. Over the years, the chapel has had many different uses, including a time as a gunpowder store. The chapel celebrated the 900th anniversary of Margaret's death in 1993 when it was renovated by Historic Scotland and its interior refurbished by St Margaret's Chapel Guild, whose members all share the name Margaret and live in Scotland. After our castle visit, **continue to "The Scotch Whiskey Experience" for a whisky tasting tour.** Learn how Scotch Whiskey is made and how distinct aromas are achieved. The tour ends with a "nosing" and tasting of your choice! Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Edinburgh. (B,D)

Day 4 Thursday, June 22: St. Andrews

Breakfast at our hotel. This morning, we'll have a special two-hour tour of the Palace of Holyroodhouse, which includes the remains of 12th-century Holyrood Abbey, the Palace gardens, and the State Apartments. Today, Holyroodhouse is the official residence of the British Royal Family in Edinburgh. Then, board our bus and cross the famous Firth of Forth as we travel to the fishing community of Anstruther. Independent lunch at the best Fish and Chips house in Britain.

Continue to St. Andrews, Scotland's oldest university town and mecca for golfers worldwide. A religious community was probably first located on this site in about 732 AD, when relics of St Andrew were brought to what was then known as Kilrimont or Cennrìgmonaid. The settlement that became St. Andrews rose through the dark ages to an eminent position in the Scottish church, a process that was accelerated when Viking raids led to the removal of St. Columba's relics from Iona in 849 AD, and with them much of Iona's power base. Explore the ruins of St. Andrews' medieval cathedral and watch duffers playing The Old Course. **Celebrate Mass at St. James Catholic Church.** Return to Edinburgh for dinner.

Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Edinburgh. (B,D)

Day 5 Friday, June 23: Crannog Centre | Fort William

Breakfast at our hotel. Breakfast at our hotel. Today we'll depart Edinburgh to the Scottish Crannog Centre for a guided tour of the museum, alongside a number of interactive demonstrations of ancient crafts and technologies. You will hear stories of the people that inhabited Loch Tay 2500 years ago on these truly unique buildings called 'Crannogs'. Independent lunch in Pitlochry. (Possible photo opportunity stop at Loch Ness.) In the afternoon, we'll

continue to Fort William, nestled at the foot of dramatic Ben Nevis, Britain's highest mountain, at 4,406 feet. The town takes its name from the fort that William, Prince of Orange, had built here in 1690. Fort William is the main center of activity for the Western Highlands. **Mass at St. Mary's Church.** Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Fort William. (B,D)

Day 6 Saturday, June 24: Ben Nevis | Fort William and Glenfinnan

Breakfast at our hotel. **Celebrate Mass at St. Mary's Church.**

Optional Ben Nevis Hike (full-day hike, 7-9 hours): Today you will have the opportunity to join Father Dave on a hike up Ben Nevis, a unique way of celebrating and offering thanksgiving to God for the silver jubilee of his priesthood. For those who are able, the climb up Ben Nevis will take around 4 hours and the return around 3 hours.

For those who are unable to participate in the full-day hiking excursion, you may spend the day in Fort William with plenty of time for shopping, browsing, and relaxing. There are restaurants and gift shops to suit all tastes and a number of specialist outlets. For non-climbers, a guide will also take you to see the striking Bonnie Prince Charlie monument at Glenfinnan. On August 19, 1745, a small rowing boat landed at the north end of Loch Shiel. Prince Charles Edward Stuart, "Bonnie Prince Charlie," came ashore and met his escort of 50 MacDonalds before retiring to a nearby barn to await the response to letters he had sent to possible supporters all over the Highlands. Another 150 MacDonalds came on the scene. Then, 1,000 men of the Clan Cameron arrived from Achnacarry and Loch Arkaig, and 300 Macdonnells arrived later. Judging that he had enough support to mount his rebellion, Charles Edward Stuart climbed the hill behind today's NTS Visitor Center and raised his standard. A brief ceremony followed, and the prince then ordered that brandy be distributed (the '45 was born). The rebellion ended in bloody failure at Culloden on April 16, 1746. In its aftermath, the Highland way of life was swept away.

Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Fort William. (B,D)

Day 7 Sunday, June 25: Killmartin Glen | Bonny Loch Lomond | Glasgow

Breakfast at our hotel. Continue to Killmartin Glen, famous for its rich historical legacy. There are at least 350 ancient monuments within six miles of Killmartin village, of which around 150 are prehistoric. We will see burial cairns, rock carvings, standing stones, and Killmartin House Museum during our morning in the glen. Continue to the Bonny Banks of Loch Lomond area. Measuring twenty-seven and a half square miles, Loch Lomond, formed during the Ice Age by the action of glaciers, is the largest single inland waterway in Britain. There are 37 islands in the loch, some having been utilized as retreats for early Christians. One island, Inchmurrin, takes its name from the missionary St. Mirrin who spent some time there. We will stop in the picturesque village of Luss on the west bank of Loch Lomond for a brief visit. Legend has it that the village takes its name from an adaptation of the French for the heraldic flower, the Fleur-de-Lys or iris. According to the legend, a local girl married a high-ranking French officer in the 14th century. She died in France, but her body was returned to Loch Lomond for burial. Fleur-de-Lys were said to have been strewn on her grave by her husband, and to have taken root and grown here ever since. Independent lunch. Continue to Glasgow.

Celebrate Mass at St. Peter's Catholic Church. Check-in at our hotel. Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Glasgow. (B,D)

Day 8 Monday, June 26: Glasgow | Stirling | Edinburgh

Breakfast at our hotel. **Celebrate Mass at St. Mary's Catholic Church.** Begin our day with a tour of Glasgow. Glasgow's origins lie with a Christian missionary called Mungo, or Kentigern, who established a church here. By 600 AD, St. Mungo was the Archbishop of the Kingdom of Strathclyde, whose kings resided at Dumbarton Castle. It is usually thought that the name Glasgow comes from St Mungo's description of the community that grew up here as Clas-gu or "dear family." Glasgow spent the next thousand years as an important ecclesiastical center. This engine for growth stopped dead in its tracks with the coming of the Reformation in 1560, which, although left Glasgow Cathedral miraculously unscathed, swept away the power structure of the existing church in Glasgow and Scotland. After our visit to the cathedral, we'll visit Stirling, the famous castle of the Stuart Kings. During its long and bloody history, Stirling Castle has been attacked or besieged at least 16 times. Independent lunch. This afternoon, we'll continue to Edinburgh. **Enjoy a traditional Scottish farewell dinner.** Overnight at our hotel in Edinburgh. (B,D)

Day 9 Tuesday, June 27: Return to the USA

Breakfast at our hotel. After breakfast, transfer to Edinburgh Airport to check-in for our return flight home. Arrive the same day. (B)

Acceptance of these Terms & Conditions, with signature on enrollment form, is required for participation in this tour.

PAYMENT: All payments will be accepted in the form of check, money order, or debit/credit card.
